#### WEEK OF:

#### TO DO AS THE CHILDREN ARRIVE:

#### PRAYER: (3 minutes)

#### MEMORY VERSE: (7 minutes)

<u>1 Corinthians 15:58</u> – "... <u>Be</u> ye steadfast, unmoveable, <u>always abounding in the work of the</u> Lord...."

(The underlined portion of the verse indicates what the younger children should memorize. See "Involvement Helps for Younger Children" for helps in teaching the verse to the younger children.)

"Guess Who" – After you have read this verse from the Bible, explained what it means, and repeated it at least two times, you may begin this drill. Choose a child to be the "Guesser." The "Guesser" will come and stand with his back to the group. Another child is silently selected to say the reference by himself, but the whole group repeats the rest of the verse together. The one who is the "Guesser" must guess who said the reference. To make it more challenging, the person saying the reference may try to disguise his voice as long as he is loud enough to be heard. Repeat several times choosing different children to be the "Guesser" and the one saying the reference.

#### BIBLE LESSON: (20 minutes)

#### **COUNSEL TIME:**

(If you have a helper, hostess, or Teacher Junior Grade, let them do the review time while you counsel those who responded to the invitation. Otherwise, at the end of club, be sure to remind them to stay for a few minutes so you can counsel them.)

#### E.O.T.O.: (2 minutes)

"Jesus Loves Even Me" Miniature – Explain how to use the Each One Tell One (E.O.T.O.). Tell them they will receive one at the end of club today. Encourage them to share at the next club any opportunity they had to share the "Jesus Loves Even Me" Miniature with a friend or a family member. Ask the Lord to use this E.O.T.O. for His glory.

#### TAKE TIME TO REVIEW/QUIET TIME NOTEBOOK: (1 minute)

From the returned TTtR/Q.T.N.s, mention one or two of the children's responses to the Main Truth challenge. Hand out Take Time to Review/Quiet Time Notebook, The First Century Church #5. Ask the children to complete the booklet before the next club. Remind them that they need to show you their TTtR/Q.T. Notebook next week.

#### REVIEW ACTIVITY: (6 minutes)

Use the activity below or the Bible Learning Game from "Involvement Helps for Younger Children."

"Which Hand?" – You will need a penny. Explain the game something like this: "Did you and a friend ever play the game of guessing which hand the penny is in? We are going to play it today here in club. Let's begin by dividing you into two teams. Here is Team A, and here is Team B. I will ask Team A a question first, and whoever knows the answer may raise their hand quietly. If I call on you and you have the right answer, you will get 100 points for your team. You can then get 100 bonus points for your team if you, with one try, guess which hand the penny is in. Then Team B will have a turn." Each time before the child comes to guess, put your hands behind your back to hide the penny and then bring closed hands out in front of you. Continue playing this game as time permits with teams alternating turns. The winning team is the one that has the most points at the end of the game. - Ralph Bechtel.

Review questions for THE FIRST CENTURY CHURCH #5:

- 1. What was Saul boldly preaching in the synagogue? ("Jesus is the Son of God")
- 2. What did Saul do in Arabia for several years? (He spent time alone with God prayed, studied the Scriptures)
- 3. What did the Jewish religious leaders in Damascus want to do to Saul? (Kill him)
- **4.** Why couldn't Saul leave Damascus through the city gates? (His enemies were watching for him and would capture him)
- 5. How did Saul escape from the city of Damascus? (His friends lowered him in a basket through an opening in the city wall)
- **6.** Why were the believers in Jerusalem afraid of Saul when he first arrived there? (They didn't believe he had truly become a believer)
- 7. How did Barnabus help Saul? (He convinced the other believers that Saul was no longer their enemy, he was a true believer)
- **8. After listening to Barnabus, what did the disciples in Jerusalem do?** (They accepted Saul into their fellowship. He went around Jerusalem with them.)
- 9. If Jesus is your Saviour, who will help you to stand up for what is right? (The Holy Spirit)

#### **INTRODUCE THE VERSE:**

Have you ever seen an inflatable toy or a beach ball floating on the water? What happens to it when the wind blows or when someone jumps into the water? It moves around, doesn't it? It doesn't stay still. Sometimes people are like that. Instead of being sure of and true to what we believe, we change our minds about what we believe. Our memory verse today tells those of us who know Jesus as our Saviour that we should not be like that. Listen to today's verse.

#### **READ THE VERSE:**

Read the verse together from the visualized verse. Then read the verse directly from the Bible.

#### **EXPLAIN THE VERSE:**

1 Corinthians 15:58

"steadfast," – To be "steadfast" means to be strong and confident in your faith. Be faithful to the Lord and to His teaching.

"unmoveable," — To be "unmoveable" means to be firm, not changing your mind about what you believe about the Gospel.

"always abounding in the work of the Lord."

– Keep doing the things that God wants you to do here on Earth. Keep telling other people about Jesus. Keeping living in a right way that is pleasing to God. God will bless and reward those who keep serving Him.

#### **Memory Verse**

#### Flashcard 5-1:

Have children repeat the words, "Jesus is the Son of God!"

#### **Bible Learning Game**


Line all the children up in a row (like on a bus) with the teacher as the leader. Everyone walks around the room following the leader, moving their arms in a circle (like the wheels of a bus turning) while singing the words below to the tune of "The Wheels on the Bus."

"The Holy Spirit can help you stand, Help you stand, help you stand. The Holy Spirit can help you stand, For what is right."

When the song is finished, say to the children, "Sometimes it may seem like everyone around you is doing wrong, and it's not easy to choose to stand up and do what is right. Who can help you to do what is right?" Allow children to respond together. Then say something like, "Yes, if Jesus is your Saviour, God the Holy Spirit can help you stand up for what is right just like He helped Saul." Repeat as time allows.

#### LEARNING ABOUT THE BIBLE & THE OLD TESTAMENT BOOKS

**WEEK #5** 



(Place figure #1.) The first five books of the Old Testament were written by Moses. They are called the books of Law. (Place figure #31.) The books of Law tell about God's care for His special people, the Jews, and His wonderful promises to them. (Place figure #32.) The names of these books are Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy. (Place Genesis wordstrip.) Genesis means "beginning." This book tells about the beginning of the world, man, sin, salvation, and many other things. (Place Exodus wordstrip.) Exodus means "going out," and it describes the going out of the Israelites from Egypt. (Place Leviticus wordstrip.) Leviticus lists the laws the Jewish people were to obey. The priests, or Levites, led the people in the keeping of these laws, and that is where the book gets its name. (Place Numbers wordstrip.) In Numbers, two censuses, or countings of the people, are recorded. It is like a diary describing the people of Israel marching through the wilderness toward the Promised Land. (Place Deuteronomy wordstrip.) Deuteronomy means "second law" because the law is repeated in this book. Let us say the five books of Law together. (Practice several times saying the five names of the books of Law.)



#### GO AND TELL BOX WEEK #4 – INTRODUCE THE JENKINS

#### **Information**

(Suggested item to put in the "Go and Tell" Box – a small plastic plane or picture of a plane.)

What do you think a plane has to do with *going* and telling? (Let the children share their ideas.)



Many missionaries fly on a plane when they are going to the place where God has called them to serve Him. Some missionaries also need a plane on the mission field to travel and to transport supplies from village to village.

The father of one of the missionaries that we are going to learn about this year was a missionary pilot. Let me tell you about this missionary couple. They are Mr. and Mrs. Jenkins. (Show their picture.) We will call them Mr. Jared and Mrs. Cindy. Mr. Jared was born and raised in the country of India where his parents were missionaries. Mrs. Cindy grew up in Nigeria, West Africa. Mrs. Cindy's parents were missionaries there. Her father was a missionary pilot.

The Jenkins have served for many years as missionaries in the country of Suriname, located in the northern part of South America. Now Mr. Jared and Mrs. Cindy live in Florida, where they have a ministry sharing the Good News of Jesus' love with international students who come to the United States to study at a college. They also share each summer in Good News Day Camps. Some of our missionary offering will be sent to help Mr. Jared and Mrs. Cindy, and we will learn more about them later this year.

**THANK** God for Mr. Jared and Mrs. Cindy as they faithfully share the Gospel with many people through their current ministry to the international students.

**ASK** God to help people remember to pray for the Jenkins and that they will give of their money so Mr. Jared and Mrs. Cindy can continue to serve the Lord among international students in the U.S.A.
